OVERCOMING CHALLENGES THROUGH THE RQI[®] PROGRAM

As for most healthcare organizations, the coordination of BLS training programs proves to be challenging. To overcome these challenges, all while improving their quality of care, Eastern Regional Health Authority implemented the Resuscitation Quality Improvement[®] (RQI[®]) program as the standard for basic life support training in 2021.

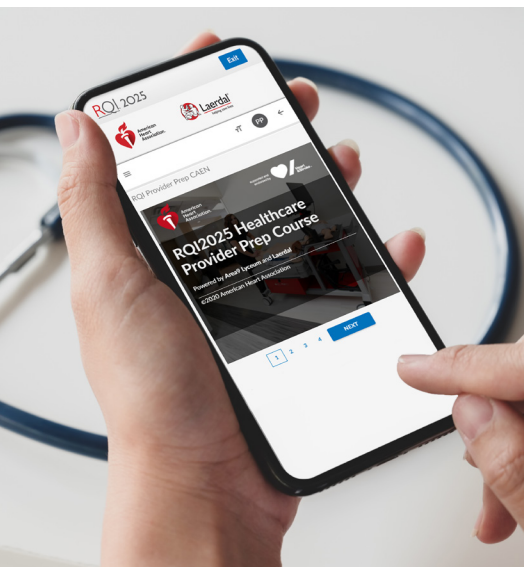


ORGANIZATION'S HIGH COMPLIANCE RATES DRIVEN BY THE PROGRAM'S DESIGN

RQI IN ACTION: THE PROGRAM'S POSITIVE IMPACT ON EASTERN HEALTH'S STAFF

The RQI program's design brings frequency and consistency to resuscitation education, which are integral to improving their providers' ability to deliver high-quality CPR when responding to cardiac arrest events.

Resuscitation Quality Improvement:

- Provides a high-reliability platform for simulation-based mastery learning implemented through low-dose, high-frequency quality improvement sessions that measure and verify CPR competence.
- Supports mastery of High-Quality CPR skills through feedback-driven deliberate practice.
- Skills sessions last approximately 5-10 minutes per quarter while cognitive learning activities last up to 35 minutes per quarter.
- Administrators will have analytic data related to all activities performed. Tracking of performance and related continuous quality improvements initiatives related to resuscitation can be tracked and monitored.
- Simulation stations deployed at locations conveniently accessed 24/7 by students, allowing skills modules to be completed during the normal shift.

Growth in Skills Retention:

Learners enrolled in RQI improved their overall High-Quality CPR scores captured in the Baseline Skills Assessments (without feedback) over a period of a year:

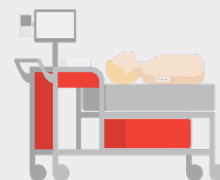
from 71% to 90% for Adult/Child Compressions
from 67% to 92% for Adult/Child Ventilations

The Power of Feedback:

Learners enrolled in RQI corrected their performance and improved their overall High-Quality CPR scores from Baseline (without feedback) to the Skills Assessment (with feedback):

from 53% to 96% for Infant Compressions
from 51% to 95% in for Infant Ventilations

This data is a compilation of learner performance for RQI skills at Eastern Health from October 2021 to September 2022. Learner performance data is collected during the Enrollment Assignment, and then every quarter when a learner completes Baseline (without feedback) and Skills Assessment (with feedback). Learners are evaluated on rate and volume for ventilations and rate, depth, hand placement, recoil and CCF skills for compressions. All scores are median values presented in this case study.



LOOKING TOWARD THE FUTURE

As the RQI program expands, Eastern Health is confident it will continue to drive increased skills competency for their providers across the organization.
